

Fantastic Feedback: School Tutor Survey Results

Thank you to our partner schools who completed the Connex Education Partnership School Survey in January 2023. We are delighted to share the fantastic feedback we received:

- 100% of schools would recommend Connex Education Partnership to others.
- 96% of schools believe that the tuition has had a positive impact on pupils overall.
- 92% of schools are very happy with the tuition provision provided by Connex Education Partnership's tutors.

Whole School Mental Health and Wellbeing

Senior Mental Health Lead Training

Uptake of the Senior Mental Health Lead (SMHL) funding has been strong, with settings now applying and developing their strategies following involvement in the training.

State of the nation 2022: children and young people's wellbeing

The recent publication of the Department for Education's research report into the wellbeing of pupils, reveals a perhaps unsurprising mixed picture of how children and young people are coping with issues surrounding physical and mental health.

Whilst some of the research indicates that levels of wellbeing have returned to prepandemic levels, variations within subgroups paint an inconsistent picture. The full report can be accessed **here**, and would be of interest and use to pastoral leads in schools who may be able to apply some of the findings to your whole school approach.

Active Lives and Healthy School Rating Scheme

How does your school compare to others in the promotion and achievement of healthy lifestyles for students? Whilst every school undoubtedly strives to ensure healthy diets and frequent exercise for its students, wouldn't it be reassuring to receive some impartial feedback about how successful you have been?

In participation with Sport England, schools are invited to complete the healthy schools rating scheme survey, designed to recognise and encourage schools' contributions to pupils' health and wellbeing. Primarily looking at healthy eating and physical activity, the survey celebrates areas of success and makes recommendations for improvements. Once completed, schools will receive a grading and award which can be used as a platform for accelerated progress. Intensive Intervention in Years 7 and 8 Literacy

The Education Endowment Foundation* are looking for 100 participant schools to engage in their 'Switch On' Literacy Project. Tailored to students in Years 7 and 8, the project offers intensive individualised, daily, ten-week reading intervention delivered by Nottinghamshire County Council and available to all schools in England, including special schools. Opportunities to Study and Work Abroad

Now entering its third year, the government's Turing Scheme, designed world-wide provide international study placements to schools, colleges and universities, is now open applications. Offering funded, changing study abroad placements for young people, the Turing Scheme aims to promote equal opportunities for all, increasing social mobility and developing key life skills. An example of a successful application made in last year's funding round was when a group of students from Blackburn were able to travel to Morocco for two weeks to complete local community and charity work, intertwined with their own curriculum. Have you seen the new EEF Early Years Evidence Store?

Designed to support schools put evidence-informed approaches into practice, the new Education Endowment Foundation (EEF)* Evidence Store will grow over time to encompass key themes around Early Years Education. Currently hosting two themes (Communication and Language and Personal Social and Emotional Development), the EEF said:

The Early Years Evidence Store is a summary of evidence-informed approaches to help educators to understand and reflect on their practice. The approaches are illustrated with practices that typically make-up the approach and a range of examples of what these might look like in practice.

The Early Years Evidence Store demonstrates that the approaches and practices can be implemented with children across different contexts for teaching and learning spanning adultled and child-led learning opportunities in the Early Years Pedagogical Continuum.
