

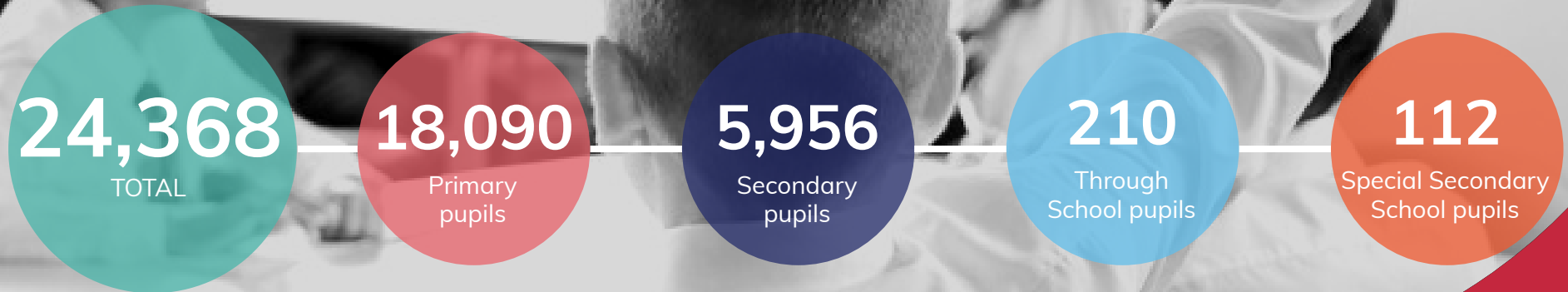

Connex Education Partnership is proud to be playing its part in the national effort on pupil catch up.



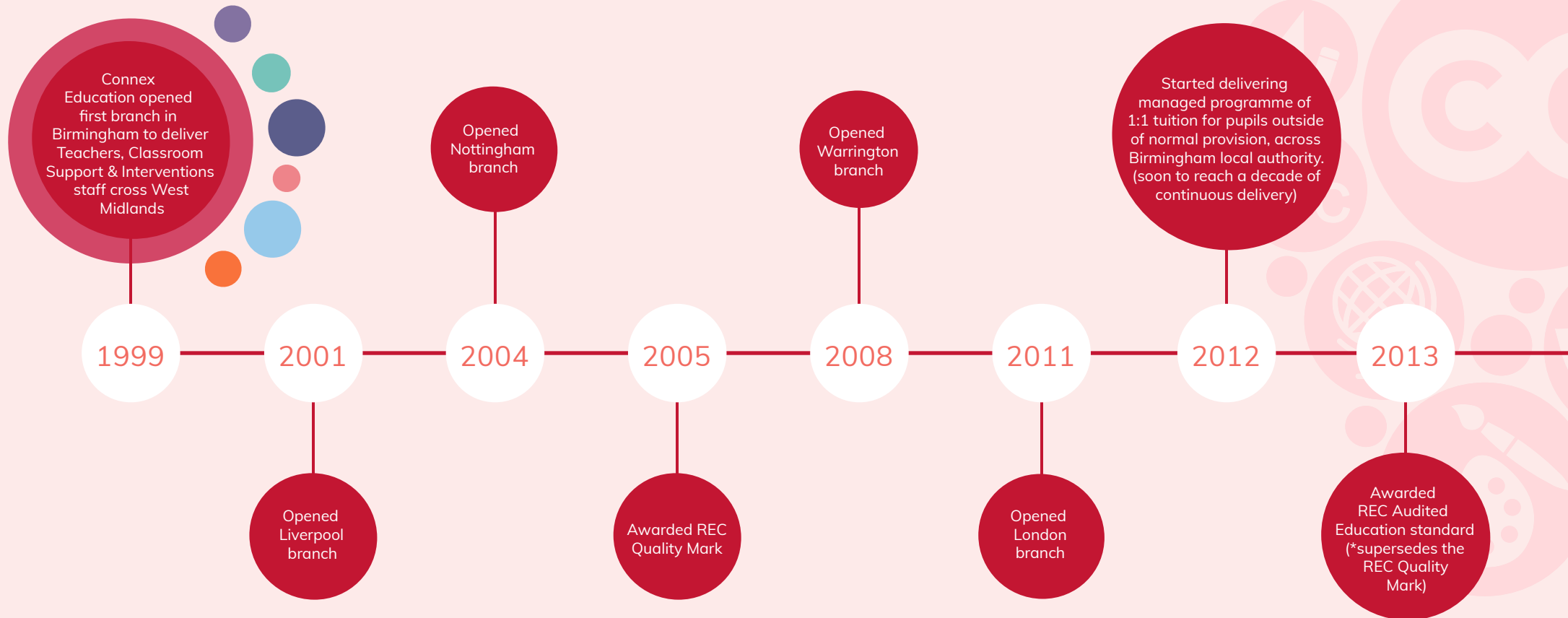

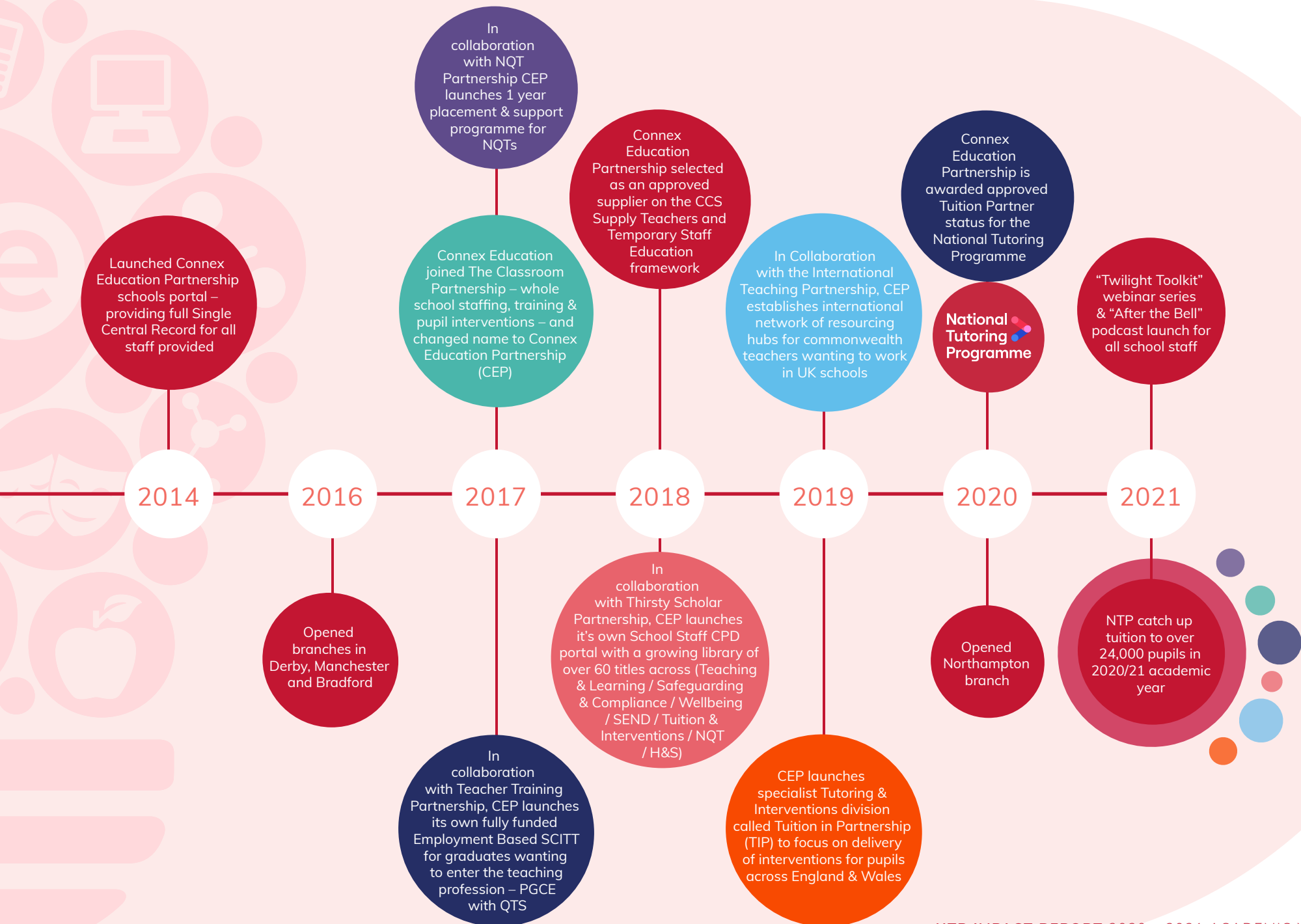

Tuition & Interventions for over 2 decades





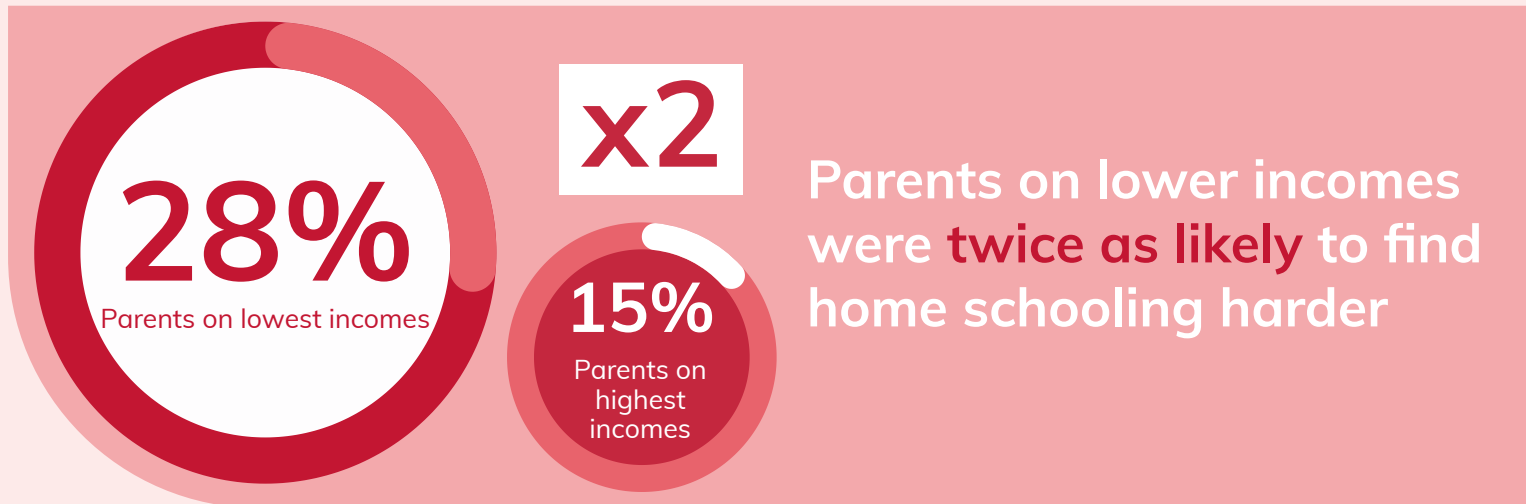
Why we matter

Our challenge - Plugging the gap

Before we had even heard of COVID-19, the EEF had already identified the significant attainment gap for disadvantaged pupils and made recommendations for a tiered approach to Pupil Premium spending. Once the pandemic hit, whilst schools, teachers and their community made a herculean effort to continue to educate their pupils through lockdown, there continues to be concerns around lost learning as pupils return to the classroom.

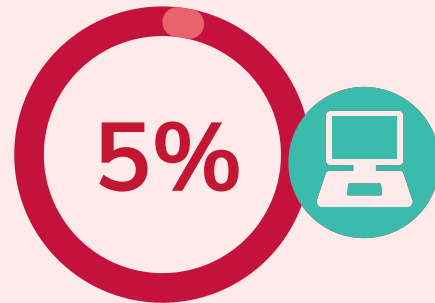
The Sutton Trust also identified that pupils experiences of access to learning varied significantly according to their socio-economic situations. Their research recommended that “disadvantaged pupils should have access to additional one-to-one or small group tuition to reduce the impact of school closures” and that “schools should consider running catch-up classes for children from poorer backgrounds over the summer”.

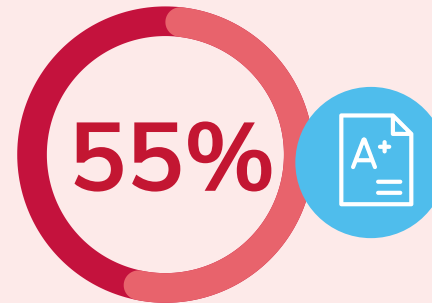

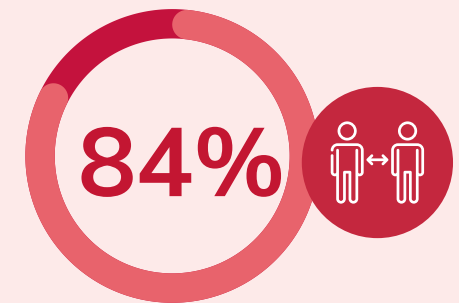

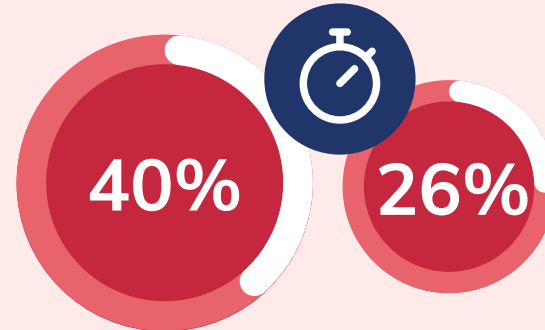
During the first lockdown only **5%** of teachers in state schools reported all their students had access to an appropriate device for remote learning.



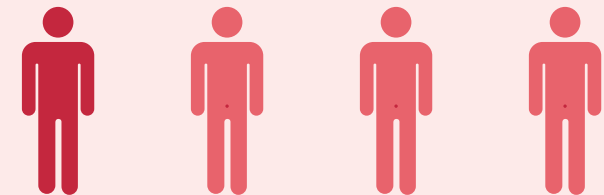
Teachers reported that **over half** of their pupils' work was of normal standard.



Teachers reported the **disruption** from the pandemic would increase the attainment gap.



During lockdown – **40%** of children from **affluent areas** reported to be accessing over five hours of schooling a day, **compared to 26%** from less affluent backgrounds.



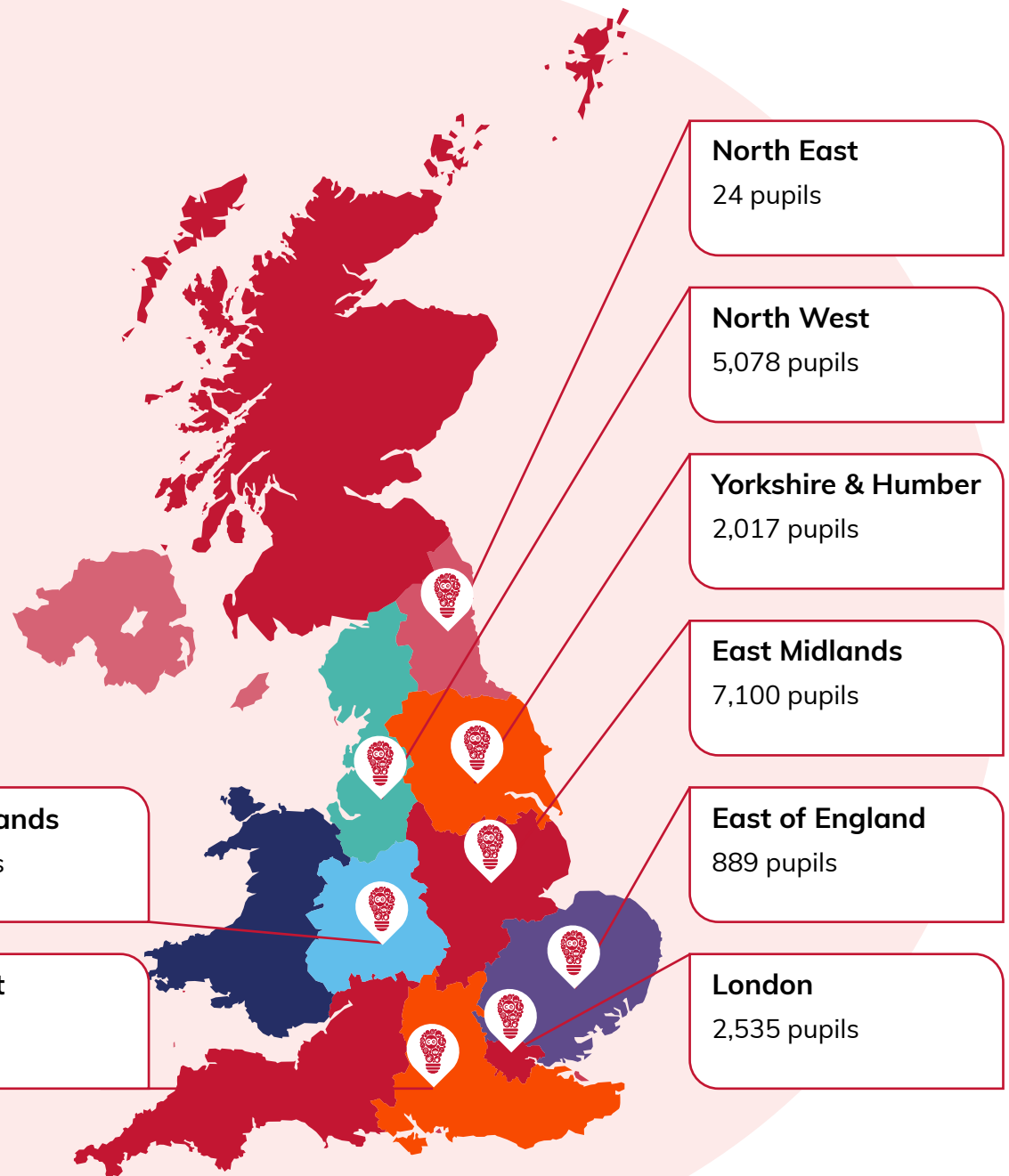
24% of teachers said that **fewer than 1 in 4** children in their class returned work they had been set during lockdown.

School access to tuition support

All our tutors are teachers with QTS - we support great teachers to become excellent tutors.
We provide free, ongoing, CPD accredited training delivered by our sister company, Thirsty Scholars Partnership.

Embedded: Subsidised Tuition

The National Tutoring Programme in Year 2 will subsidise 70% of a school's tuition costs when they use an approved Tuition Partner. This means that Connex Education Partnership can deliver high quality tuition from as little as £4.90* per pupil per hour cost to the school.

*based on a tutor: pupil ratio of 1:3

Collaboration: Flexible solutions

Tuition must be arranged in 15-hour blocks and can be delivered flexibly to suit the needs of the school and pupils, in-person or online. With CEP, all of our tutors' reports are recorded within an accessible, secure online portal, allowing schools to track progress.

Development: Tutor professional development

All our tutors are teachers with recent classroom experience and QTS. We have a wide range of available tutors who have completed our suite of accredited CPD tutoring onboarding courses. They are also provided with further training such as, "re-engaging the reluctant student" and "tutoring online".

Online or face to face delivery

We know the important role technology has played in recent times, which is why we can deliver tutoring online as well as in-person. We'll provide the support and training if you choose to tutor online.

School Onboarding Process



Step 1

Schools registers interest for NTP intervention through the NTP portal and opts for **Connex Education Partnership** as their Tuition Partner.



Step 2

School receives NTP Evaluation Guidance Document, pupil(s)/parent(s) communication pack and signs NTP MoU through **CEP**.



Step 3

School registers pupil(s) who have a need for NTP tuition catch up funding. School provides confirmation of the following:



Step 4

School's pupil(s) grouped and matched to a tutor aligned with school pedagogy and required school learning outcomes.



Step 5

School chooses own baseline assessment and/or selects from **CEP's** assessment package.



Step 6

If the school has decided to access the **CEP** Baseline Assessment:



Step 7

Tutor uses data gathered to inform their support of pupil(s) in collaboration with school pedagogy and required school learning outcomes.



Step 8

Tutoring blocks commence. Session observations, learning outcomes, and any pupil(s) safeguarding concerns are recorded in secure tutor portal for school and tutor reference



Step 9

At the end of the tutoring block, pupil(s) takes endpoint assessments to measure impact progress and improvements. School can access the data on-demand to use for the future and if required the next interventions with the pupil(s)

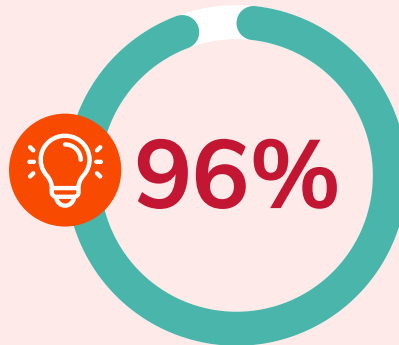

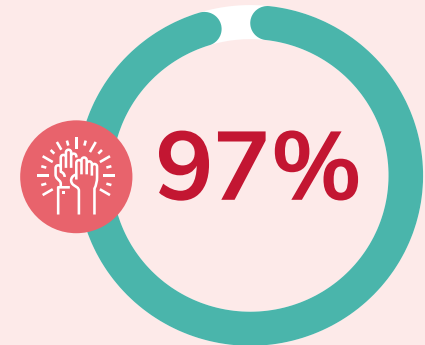
95% of schools reported pupils progressed at least one level.

Tutor Quality Assurance



Step 1

Tutor registers interest and passes the following recruitment process:



Step 2

Tutor given access to our Tutor Training onboarding CPD and platform. Initial requirement is to complete mandatory modules and an expectation to work through the required (60+) titles over time as part of their identified development plan.



Step 3

Tutor is invited to our out of school hours schedule of webinars "Twilight Toolkit" and "After the Bell" podcast. Tutor is given unique PIN access to our School Intervention Portal for data collation, reporting, observations and any safeguarding concerns.



Step 4

Tutor is assigned to pupil(s) based on alignment factors including: School pedagogy, Pupil(s) and school required learning outcomes, baseline assessment data and any particular SEND requirements. The CEP Account Manager introduces tutor to the school and ensures relevant school data, baseline data, target outcomes and pedagogy is understood.



Step 5

Tutor and school agree pedagogy and required learning outcomes by individual pupil need and any specific school relevant communication requests, alongside safeguarding/whistleblowing processes.



Step 6

The CEP Account Manager calls candidate to see how their first tutoring session went and makes notes of any feedback.



Step 7

Head of Quality and Impact, as part of the QA team, draws up session plan review and either face to face or virtual observation schedule within the first term. QA team will observe tutor, review use of portal (observations/record keeping) and in the spirit of continuous development and improvement, provide developmental feedback as appropriate. A tutor development plan is drawn up. It is a mandatory requirement that tutors report all pupil safeguarding concerns immediately to their school liaison and the CEP DSO for escalation and recording on our risk log.



Step 8

At the end of the tutoring block, endpoint assessments taken by pupil(s) are used to measure tutor academic and wider impact. Anonymised data will be used to inform QA and annual CEP impact reporting.



Step 9

As part of CEP's continued commitment to quality assurance of their tuition provision and a continuous feedback loop, all tutor observation reports will be reviewed on a quarterly basis through standardisation at director level and used to inform further wider thematic professional development and quality assurance requirements.

- 1 Tutor completes in-depth face to face interview with a trained interviewer, who has undertaken Safer Recruitment Training
- 2 Provides evidence and reference of experience
- 3 Provides evidence of teaching qualification and/or QTS
- 4 Clears candidates Safer Recruitment Practices and DBS check
- 5 Tutor signs up to CEP Safeguarding Commitment Policy
- 6 Tutor signs up to The Tutor Association Code of Conduct and CEP's Quality & Impact policy.
