#### 1 in 10 Children too Poor to Eat

The 2023 PISA\* (Programme for International Student Assessment) league table report indicated that 10% of children and young people in the UK are too poor to eat 3 meals a day. One in ten children report skipping at least one meal per day as a result of not being able to afford the food. Similar statistics have been reported in countries such as Moldova and Mexico. PISA also reported that the UK's student attainment data continues to be relatively strong, with a ranking of 11th out of the 81 countries who participated. This is somewhat surprising given that 10% of our school populations may be frequently hungry. Loic Menzies (former CEO of the Centre for Education and Youth\*) raised a pertinent question on publication of these figures when he asked 'how good would those results be looking if we were prioritising other aspects of young people's lives?'. At Connex Education Partnership, we wholeheartedly agree that there is little more

important than ensuring pupils start the day with a full tummy ready for learning. The impacts of hunger on concentration levels are well documented. That's why over the last 9 months, we've been fundraising for Magic Breakfast to pay for 1 million stigma free, easy access, school breakfasts. To date we have already raised over £55,768, which equates to 199,172 breakfasts. Through sponsored physical endurance tests and generous donations, we're proud to have already been able to make a positive contribution to the life chances of pupils up and down the country. #### Ed Sheeran and Dua Lipa Offer Support to Andrew Lloyd Webber

Huge music stars including Coldplay, Liam Gallagher, Ed Sheeran and Dua Lipa have cosigned a letter to Prime Minister Rishi Sunak and leader of the Labour Party Sir Keir Starmer, calling for more funding to support music education for schools in disadvantaged areas. Already supporting 20,000 disadvantaged children in locations such as Barnsley, Middlesbrough and London, the Music in Secondary Schools Trust\* (MiSST) is Lloyd Webber's charitable organisation designed to provide free access to musical instruments and weekly lessons.



According to data from the trust, the impact of learning a musical instrument spans far further than simple enjoyment and development of a skill but can have significant impact on the life chances of young people including potentially enhancing the chance of accessing a topflight university. A spokesperson for the MiSST said that 'If governments are serious about creating equal opportunity in education, programmes like MISST are exactly where they should be focused.' # The Dangers of Vaping

Schools nationwide are reporting a surge in the number of students known to smoke ecigarettes, or vapes as they are sometimes known. A survey conducted by the NASUWT\* in September 2023 found that '75% of teachers stated that vaping had increased in schools in the past year.' In some worst case situations, some teachers reported that some secondary aged students were having to leave lessons in order to vape, with a some primary school teachers stating the children as young as ten had brought vapes into school. Whilst it is most often a nicotine substance smoked through an a-cigarette, some secondary schools in south east England have recently dealt with young people smoking class B drugs (such as THS the psychoactive element of cannabis) through a vape. The impact of vaping is having widespread impact on education, particularly at Key Stage 3 and above.



For schools looking to bolster their approach to tackling vaping, the guidance produced by the Action on Smoking and Health\* (ASH) advocacy group may be of use. A briefing for schools looking to write or improve an antivaping policy can be found <u>here</u>, alongside plenty of useful and accessible information. In addition, you may find your local authority has produced teaching and learning resources such as those by <u>Sheffield City</u> <u>Council\*</u> and <u>Healthy Schools</u> <u>Cambridgeshire and Peterborough\*.</u> The fantastic team at the PSHE Association\* have also created a bespoke course specifically for Year 9 which can be incorporated into your Personal Development programme. #### **Brew Monday**




