Quality Assurance Updates

The Quality Assurance meetings continue to run throughout the year and if we have not yet been in contact with you to arrange a meeting, you can expect us to do this in the coming weeks. We are thrilled with your positive engagement with the **quality assurance programme**, it clearly demonstrates your commitment to continued professional development and your passion for supporting your pupils as effectively as possible.

We are pleased to share that all tutoring seen during Autumn term was identified as good or better with 71% of tutor reviews identifying exceptional tutoring when mapped to the 22 standards of tutoring excellence.

Of the tutor reviews conducted, the most common standards identified for improvement are:

- le. Learning outcomes and objectives are clear and concise, allowing pupils to understand how it fits into their wider learning.
- 3f. Teaching of subject specific examination rubric/assessment criteria (including use of models and mark schemes) is effective.
- 4d. Feedback (written and verbal) is impactful and allows pupils to make further progress in their learning.
- 4e. Pupils self-assess their progress, allowing them to identify and act on their own areas for development.







We do recognise that for standard 3f, this may not be applicable to your session, and where this is the case this will be recorded as not applicable rather than not demonstrated. We would encourage you to give some thought to whether you demonstrate these standards in your session, and if not how can you begin to integrate them in upcoming tutoring sessions. 
of our schools and tutors reported that tuition had a positive impact on pupil attainment

Has a lovely rapport with both staff and children. Works closely with all class teachers to ensure the best outcomes for the children.


Tuition Case Studies
